Number of voters down at Tuesday's Republican caucus

Turnout for Tuesday night's Grant Township Republican caucus was down from four years ago.

A total of 420 voters cast ballots, said caucus chairman Rod Kaag. The number is down from more than 500 at the last caucus.

At press time, with nearly half the votes counted, Bill Boose was leading the race to be supervisor. Boose garnered 76 votes, followed by Teresa Sollars with 57, Sharon Johnson with 34 and Valarie Paulson with 18.

In the assessor's contest, incumbent Susie Sheppard narrowly led assistant Sandy McCord 100 to 97.

With 100 votes counted in the trustee race, incumbents Dale Lithgow and Connie Wilson led with 73 and 69 votes, followed by challenger Rich Thompson with 58 and incumbent Steve Willard with 50.

Challengers Charles Potter and Jean Minick rounded out the field with 39 and 38 votes, respectively.

In uncontested races, highway commissioner Jim Crouch had 92 votes at press time, while town clerk Donna Lithgow had 93.

Although nominations from the floor were to be allowed and treated as write-in candidates, none were made.

The lesser number of voters was apparent by the total ballots cast but not by the condition of the Hoopeston City Hall. The city council chambers was seated at capacity with many voters standing, some lined up outside the chambers and even outside the building, to cast their votes.

Final vote tallies will be in tomorrow's Just the Facts.
