Local prison proposal needs more than verbal support

If I had a dollar for every time someone asked this week, "are you in favor of the new prison" I'd be sitting on some sun-drenched island, sipping a colorful drink with a little umbrella in it and typing this with one hand.

Yes, I support Hoopeston's bid to locate a prison here. The reasons are the

same as those cited by all of you who favor the prison: it will bring jobs and economic security to our town.

So now the question is how do we improve our chances of making Hoopeston not one of the top three but the top one?

I think that's up to us, Hoopeston residents. Many of us have signed petitions showing support. We've talked to friends and neighbors who disagree, pointing out the economic impact the prison could have here. But that's not enough.

We-all of us who want the prison-must attend

You can bet your buttons that those who don't want the prison will be there and will be vocal about their opposition. Part of the criteria used to determine where the prison will be is public sup-

port and we don't want to let a handful of nay-sayers block this.

There are lots of excuses for not attending the meeting. It's at 6 p.m., just finishing the supper hour. It's church night. Other people will no doubt attend so one less won't matter. You just aren't civic-minded. Horse feathers!

Eat earlier or later. Heck, bring your dinner with you. Church doesn't start until later. Those of you who think one person's voice doesn't count should remember the recent presidential election. And if you're not civic-

minded, don't blame anyone when there is no civic to mind anymore.

I think we stand a good chance of landing the prison. Another factor in choosing a final site is the need for jobs and we need those jobs, apparently more than either Grayville or Wenona.

According to the Jan. 11 issue of the Mt. Carmel Daily Republican Register, which serves Grayville, economic development there leaves some question whether the area can find enough bodies to fill the nearly 800 jobs the prison would create. That area is looking more at spin-offs from the prison such as increased housing and more businesses.

As for Wenona, making its fourth attempt to land a prison, city officials are offering a \$3.1 million incentive plan but Wenona is close to larger cities than Hoopeston and so may be less in need of the economic shot in the arm the prison would bring.

In short, we seem to be in more dire straits than Grayville or Wenona. However, that's not going to matter much if we don't show our support.

This isn't just a Hoopeston issue. Our neighboring communities will benefit if a prison is built here. Communities surrounding each of the other finalists plan a show of support at public hearings in Wenona and Grayville and we need the same show of support here.
