Healthcare foundation director, board president resign

The director and board president of the Hoopeston Area Healthcare Foundation have resigned.

Steve Margevich, director since 1997, resigned effective Jan. 10 and Bill Nicholls stepped down as president of the executive committee effective Jan. 22, said Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital CEO Frank Caruso.

Caruso would not disclose why Margevich left, saying the personnel matter is a "private, confidential issue."

Margevich did not return telephone calls and could not be reached for comment.

Caruso said Nicholl's departure was related to his promotion as CEO of Community Bank and scheduling conflicts between foundation meetings and those of another organization to which Nicholls belongs. "One can stretch themselves only so far," Caruso said, adding Nicholls had talked about stepping down for the past three or four months.

Both positions will be filled as quickly as possible. The executive committee will look not only at its members but other volunteers in the community to chair the board, Caruso said.

The foundation has is also looking for a new director. Ads appeared this weekend in regional publications from Kankakee to Decatur and in some national philanthropic magazines, Caruso said.

The resignations are not expected to adversely affect the foundation. "The foundation chairs are experienced," Caruso said. "They've all expressed their willingness to keep this thing going."

In fact, he said, several events are planned over the next few months. The community relations and annual support committees have events scheduled for March; the annual forum will be held in April; May will mark National Healthcare Week; and the special prospects committee will hold an event in June.

Committees and their chairmen include annual support, Dave McFadden; business and professional relations, Julie Mullen; special prospects, Don and Helen Burhmeister; lead gift task force, Russ Leigh; community relations, Jeanne Shore and planned gifts, Dick McMurray.

A new committee, geared solely towards farmers, is expected to be added to the roster later this year, Caruso said.


