Hoopeston Police Department releases annual crime stats

Hoopeston police were busy fighting crime in 2000.

The number of total crimes was down from last year, however violent crimes and drug arrests increased, according to annual statistics released by the department.

While an upswing in drug arrests may not seem like good news, Chief Mark Drollinger sees it differently. He called the 27 arrests—up from 21 in 1999—"absolutely wonderful." "It shows we're

more aggressive on our traffic stops. The officers are taking time to do consent searches."

Cannabis arrests stayed pearly steady from 1999 to

Cannabis arrests stayed nearly steady from 1999 to 2000 while violations of the hypodermic syringes and needles act dwindled from two in 1999 to none last year. Controlled substance arrests increased from one in 1999 to three in 2000.

Police seized assets in four drug cases last year. Of those, three were successful in the courts and one is pending, Drollinger said.

The number of local burglaries also decreased, which Drollinger attributed to "the increased presence of the officers." Some higher-crime areas have received increased attention, including officer foot patrols, he said.

Of the total number of burglaries reported, 12 arrests were made, according to state figures.

Aggravated battery, a violent crime, showed an increase over last year, with 26 cases in 2000 compared with 21 in 1999.

The number of thefts remained steady with 163 both in 1999 and 2000 while the number of auto thefts dropped from 13 to eight.

Twelve people were arrested for theft last year and five were charged with auto theft, according to state reports.

Last year was the first for investigation statistics to be released by the department. Of the 395 cases assigned to investigators, 57 percent were solved. The figure was determined by dividing the number of resolved cases by the total number of cases assigned, minus the number of cases still open.

The figures include crimes to which a report was made primarily for insurance purposes, such as scratched vehicles and slit tires. "To that victim, it's not a small case," Drollinger said. "It's a tragedy in

their world."

And smaller cases allow investigators to hone their skills for larger ones. "The only way you're going to get very good at the big ones is to be proficient on the smaller ones," he said.
