Alderman explains decision not to donate land for prison

Hoopeston officials opted not to donate land for a maximum security prison for economic reasons, according to a city alderman.

Resident Millie Sullivan, at Tuesday's council meeting questioned why the city is not donating land on which to build an 1,800-bed maximum security prison.

"When businesses come to town, they want everything," said Alderman Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman. "They're looking for the highest bid. It's hard for me to believe a state government would do that to a local government."

It would cost approximately \$800,000 to purchase the

amount but chose not to after state Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville) "indicated (donating the land) wasn't a factor," Goodwine said.

The importance of the \$800,000 land cost is relative, Goodwine said. "Out of \$140 million (the estimated cost).

The importance of the \$800,000 land cost is relative, Goodwine said. "Out of \$140 million (the estimated cost of the prison), it's practically nothing but to the people of Hoopeston, if we borrowed \$800,000, \$900,000 or even \$1 million, it's \$117,000 a year in payments," he said.

in reserves and has good enough credit to borrow that

The money needed to make the payments could represent big cuts in the city budget. Goodwine cited this year's budget, which included cuts in equipment purchases as well as smaller raises for employees. "That \$117,000 could be hard to come up with," he said.

Additionally, said Mayor Bob Ault, prison officials were aware when the city submitted its application that the land was not included in the proposal.

In unrelated action, the council accepted a \$4,300 bid from Russell Leigh & Associates to do the May audit. The cost is down from \$4,800 the last several years because Leigh is overseeing the city's books. "I think it's a fair proposal," Goodwine said.
