

## Police chief testifies on bill to register carnival workers

Hoopeston's police chief hopes to have a state-wide impact on children's safety.

Chief Mark Drollinger testified Wednesday before the Illinois House Cities and Villages Committee on legislation that would require carnivals to register their employees with local police departments.

House Bill 60, introduced by Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville) was suggested by Drollinger. If passed, it would amend the Carnival Regulation Act, requiring traveling carnivals to provide the names, Social Security numbers and birth dates of employees.

Drollinger came up with the idea after a carnival worker at the Sweetcorn Festival told him about time spent at a Florida correctional center.

The bill received bipartisan support in the committee, sending it to the full House. It also was endorsed by the

Illinois Department of Labor.

Calling carnivals the "underground railroad for criminals and transients," Drollinger said last week that law enforcement "is privy to the information if someone's going to put a seal coat on your driveway yet we can't have addresses for someone who has hand-to-hand contact with our children."

By having access to registration information, police department could check for sex offenders, parole violators and other law-breakers, he said.

Asked whether the bill sounds like guilty until proven innocent, Drollinger said "those who have nothing to hide shouldn't be worried about it."

Drollinger praised Black for his willingness to bring the issue to the legislature. "Rep. Black was, as usual, a big help in all of this," he said. "He led the charge."




