Team, individuals shine at competition Hoopeston Area High School students took top honors in its division of the Worldwide Youth in Science and Engineering competition.

Twelve schools and 162 competed in the Feb. 6 event. Students were tested in seven academic areas, including mathematics, physics, chemistry, biology, English, engineering graphics and computer science.

Hoopeston Area took top honors in the team awards, Division 700, with enrollments between 301 and 700 students. Georgetown-Ridge Farm finished second. Danville High School finished first for schools with enrollments over 700 and Rantoul High School finished

second.

In the small schools division, with enrollments under 300, Oakwood was the winner, followed by Bismarck-Henning High School and Chrisman High School.

Individual awards were also earned. Ben Greene of Hoopeston Area tied for second place in the math competition with Josh Chumbley of Rantoul Township High


