Former Hoopeston officer fired from Onarga chief's job

ONARGA—A former Hoopeston police officer has been fired as chief of Onarga police barely six months after he was fired.

Charles Moyer was fired Friday by the village board. No reason was cited for the dismissal, according to Sunday edition of *The Journal*, a Kankakee newspaper.

Also fired was Marlin Brandys, also formerly of Hoopeston, the village's only other full-time patrolman.

The firings came on the heals of a previous board meeting in which three part time officers were illegally fired, according to The Journal.

Those officers are on the police force at least until a March 19 meeting.

Moyer was hired by the Onarga Village Board at its Aug. 7 meeting. Moyer resigned from the Hoopeston Police Department on Feb. 3, 2000 after approximately 18 years.

At that time, Chief Mark Drollinger said Moyer cited burnout and a desire to find a weekday job as reasons for the resignation.




