

Hoopeston didn't grow by leaps and bounds in the last year but the 2000 census shows some growth in the city.

Census figures, released last week, show Hoopeston gained 94 residents between 1990 and 2000. The city's population last year was 5,965, according to the Census Bureau.

The official numbers reflect more people but Mayor Bob Ault said Monday the increase may be due in part to more accurate counting in the 2000 census. "I thought many of them were here all the time," he said.

Of new residents, most are retirees and younger couples with no children. "I think we'll be seeing more and more of that," he said.

Neighboring communities Rossville and Milford declined in population in the last decade. Wellington lost 30 residents, making its 2000 population 264. Milford's total went from 1.512 to 1.369 while Rossville's dipped to 1,217 from 1,334.

The numbers effect not only population signs but municipal budgets. Each of Hoopeston's 94 addi-




said.

The census figures are not a cause for celebration at Hoopeston Area schools. The district receives more than \$2,000 in state aid for each student but Hoopeston's increased population is not reflected in the number of students, said Superintendent Mark Conolly at last Thursday's school board meeting. "It's nice to know the community is growing but the school population is not," he said.


Ault said he was "surprised but pleased" by the numbers. "We have a lot to offer people in this town," he said.
