New faces square off in race for city's Ward 3 alderman

Two newcomers hope to be the new Ward 3 alderman. Kevin Davis and Tom Garrison are each running for the seat currently held by incumbent Dick Crothers who did not seek re-election.

Davis, 30, is owner of the Hoopeston Express Lube, as well as ones in Watseka and Rantoul. He cited good business sense as one asset he will bring to the council if elected.

The biggest issue facing Hoopeston is the steady decline in business and population "due to poor economy and loss of interest in the community by some of its key leaders and citizens," said Davis, who has regularly attended council meetings for over a year. "A fire needs to be relit in Hoopeston and I want to do my part in lighting it," he said.

Davis said he wants to help plot Hoopeston's course in the future. "I care about the direction Hoopeston is going and I want to help get it going in the right direction," he said.

Garrison, 63, is retired from General Motors. This is the second time he has sought to represent his ward.

Like Davis, Garrison believes getting jobs for local residents is of primary importance. "We need factories to locate here and that would create jobs in other aspects

of our city," he said.

As a retiree, Garrison said he has time to devote to the job. "(I) have free time to listen to the public and work with them on any problem they have," he said. "I could go to other cities and see and talk to public officials on how they've obtained factories and businesses to come to their vicinity."

No one can be a miracle worker but let's give Chalmers Flint a chance to turn things around.


