Grayville expected to be named site of new prison today

The race for a maximum security prison is expected to end today.

Gov. George Ryan is scheduled to be in Grayville today where he is expected to announce that community will be awarded the 1,800 bed prison.

The news is a blow to Hoopeston, which rallied behind Mayor Bob Ault's bid to land the prison.

Ault submitted an application for the prison last year. In January, he and Police Chief Mark Drollinger went to Springfield to pitch Hoopeston to the Department of Corrections. That was followed by a public hearing attended by approximately 1,000 area residents, most of

whom spoke in favor of building a prison in Hoopeston.

Ault said he talked with the Department of Corrections representatives Wednesday but that they would not confirm or deny the announcement. "I asked why he would go there for any other reason and they didn't answer that," he said.

"I'm highly disappointed," Ault said. "We made a good showing but that doesn't put bread on the table, does it?"

Drollinger said he is disappointed but "looking at the bright side, it showed how the community came together for the common good."

That Grayville was chosen was not a surprise. "Rep. (Bill) Black said all along that Hoopeston was the dark horse," Drollinger said. "I think we can come back as the front runner next time."

Mayor-elect Chalmers Flint also was not surprised Hoopeston was not chosen. "We had heard through the grapevine that it was going to Grayville," he said.

One factor may have swayed the decision, Flint said. "We had the facilities needed to attract the prison," he said. "However, we did not donate the land and I understand Grayville donated land."
