Hoopeston City Council contracts sewer treatment services

A stopgap measure will keep Hoopeston's sewer plant operating for the next few months.

The Hoopeston City Council on Tuesday approved contracting sewer operating services with ERH Enterprises of Westville.

For \$12,000 monthly, the company will oversee day-to-day operations, testing and maintenance at the plant and will hire one city employee to cover weekend duties there. All work at the plant will be overseen by a Class I operator which is required for a treatment plant the size of Hoopeston's said Alderman Don York, sewer committee chairman.

The measure is necessary to keep the plant operational after current operator Greg Gress officially leaves Friday, said Alderman Bill Goodwine. "We have to make sure the plant is legal Saturday morning."

York said the cost is comparable to what the city currently pays in wages, maintenance and testing.

York expects to run the month-to-month contract for

approximately two to three months while the committee finds a permanent solution.

A permanent solution may be to continue contracting services. However, York said a permanent contract would be less than the \$12,000 fee of the temporary one. "In the long run, it may be cheaper than what we're paying now," he said.

Alderman John Haughee disagreed with the plan, saying a sewer operator should be found who can live in Hoopeston. His was the sole dissenting vote.

In unrelated business, the council tabled a proposed change in the ambulance service contract with Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital.

The change would eliminate a \$400 per month fee now paid by the city to the hospital. Goodwine questioned language that did not specify that \$2,500 monthly, currently put in a special city fund for new ambulances and repairs over \$2,500, would be used by the hospital for new ambulances.

Controversy results in change of auditing firms in Rossville

ROSSVILLE—Controversy over accounting practices led the Rossville Village Board to change accounting firms.

"With the (financial) controversy going on, I suggest we change," said Trustee Terry Prillaman after two estimates were opened.

Trustees have been wrangling with accounting practices and changes for more than a year.

The estimates were from long-time village auditors Daughtee and Parks, for an amount not to exceed \$4,000 and from Crowder CPAs, LTD, for a range of \$3,900 to \$4,300.

The board voted unanimously to accept Crowder's estimate.

In unrelated action, the board:

- accepted the resignation of Roy Goin from the street and alley department. Goin's last day was March 29.
- approved changes in the business license and liquor ordinances, making each payable annually on Jan. 1. Fees had been paid quarterly in the past.
- tabled a request for a donation from the Rossville Little League. "We don't have any money at this time," said Mayor Merv Smith. Trustees will reconsider the request in the next fiscal year.
- installed new officers, including Mayor Terry Prillaman and trustees Richard Birkey, Mike Clutter and Bob Merritt.
