





Groups angle for donations for summer fishing program

A few Hoopeston organizations are fishing for funds. The Hoopeston Police Department, Hoopeston Multi Agency and Oat's Bait Shop are joining together to stock the McFerren Park lagoon with assorted fish as summer recreation. "Anything we can get would be greatly appreciated," said Hoopeston Police Sgt. Jim Goodrum, one of the organizers.

Residents, rather than businesses are being asked to contribute to the cause. "We're not asking businesses to donate because they're asked so many times for donations. "We'd like (the residents of) the city to do this," Goodrum said.

Money collected will be used to buy assorted fish for the lagoon, such as catfish and bass. The lagoon will be stocked with 250-300 pounds of fish every two to three weeks, at a cost of about \$500 per time, Goodrum said.

Although anyone may take advantage of fishing at the lagoon, Goodrum hopes senior citizens and children will make special use of. "Fishing is for all ages but we like to see the seniors and the kids out there because they can't go places other people can," he said. Also, older anglers can pass on knowledge to the small fry. "The seniors can teach the young kids about fishing," he said. There is a catch to the program. Until now, there has

been no limit on fish caught at the lagoon. With this program, there is a two fish, 15-inch limit, said Alderman Mike Eckersley, city parks committee chairman.

There is no limit on the number of fish that can be caught and released, Goodrum said.

Stocking of the lagoon began this month, in time for youngsters to practice for Oat's Bait Shop's "Get the Kids Into It" fishing tournament, Goodrum said.

This is the second tournament sponsored by the bait shop, located at $517\frac{1}{2}$ S. Dixie Hwy., next to the Coffee Cup. It will be held June 9 at the lagoon.

Children to age 13 may fish in the tournament, which begins at 9 a.m.

Goodrum hopes the fishing program will bring the same sense of fun and memories he experienced as a boy. "We want the kids to enjoy themselves," he said. "I can remember when I was a kid out there catching fish. We'd spend all day out there."

Collection cans have been set out in businesses in the city. Those who wish may send checks to the McFerren Park Fishing Program c/o Hoopeston City Hall, 301 W. Main, Hoopeston, IL 60942.


