Rossville trustees struggle with deficit, unpaid utility bills

ROSSVILLE—Village officials hope to have a new clearer picture of their finances next month.

At Monday's meeting, the village board discussed a \$346,000 deficit in last year's budget. The deficit was covered by a one-day bank loan which allowed village books to balance at the end of the year, said Mayor Terry Prillaman.

Obtaining a loan to cover the deficit was approved at a special meeting last month.

Although Monday's treasurer's report showed a positive balance of more than \$379,000. Prillaman said the total does not reflect the money repaid to the bank or other deductions which put the balance "in deep deficit territory."

In an effort to raise income, officials are cracking down on delinquent utility payments. Collector Chris Pearson said \$55.867.25 is owed. Of that, nearly \$18,000 is from budget billing customers, nearly \$23,000 is from customers who are late paying and more than \$8,700 is due to closed accounts.

Prillaman said the village wants to have utility ac-

counts in order by September 1. "We cannot let this go on in the financial shape this town is in," he said.

In related financial action, trustees voted unanimously to place a \$50 cap on donations to civic organizations. Three donations were approved Monday, to the American Legion for fireworks, the Beta Club towards a group rummage sale, and the town Little League.

In unrelated action, trustees:

- learned ConAgra will pay for new riprap at the sewer treatment plant, as well as for repairs to the road at the plant. A grease spill earlier this year caused the damage, said sewer superintendent Billie Kinnett. The company declined to pay for new sand at the sand filter, she added.
- will allow the Sons of the American Legion to use a village trencher. The trench will be filled with power lines for a new scoreboard.
- approved an asphalt sidewalk from Rt. 1 to Christman Park at a cost of about \$4,000.
- learned June gas rates will remain the same as May's.
- set a rabies clinic for 1-3 p.m. June 2 at the fire station.


