Health department to offer special immunization clinic

DANVILLE—Vermilion County Health Department will host a "Super Shot Saturday" this month to help parents make sure their children are ready for school.

The special immunization clinic will be held from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, June 23 at the health department, 200 South street, Suite A, Danville.

School and athletic physicals will also be offered during the special Saturday clinic hours.

The health department hopes to make it convenient for parents to meet school mandates. "We're happy to be able to set aside a Saturday for the immunizations and physicals that students will need to start their school year," said Lynn Galloway, Community Health Services Director.

Immunizations will be done on a walk-in bases at a

cost of \$7 each. Written shot records must be provided. Appointments must be made in advance for the school/athletic physicals; cost is \$30. Medicaid cards must be presented at the time of the physical and/or immunization. A parent or legal guardian must accompany the student.

Due to a nationwide problem, one mandated immunization will not be offered. Tetanus vaccinations, mandated for ninth graders, are not being given at the health department because of a manufacturing shortage that may last up to one year. Immunization coordinator Sherrie Shoemaker said students will given a signed deferment letter for their school files and their names placed on a waiting list.
