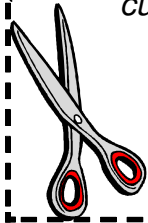

HA schools tentatively to get more state aid money next year

Hoopeston Area school officials hope to see \$187,000 more in state funding next year.

The increase is due to a change in the state aid formula and poverty grant program, said Superintendent Mark Conolly at Thursday's school board meeting.

About \$181,000 is expected from the poverty grant program. Last year, Hoopeston Area did not meet the required 20 percent of students in the poverty category. A sliding scale will be used this year so districts with impoverished children will receive some funds.

Additionally, the district expects to receive about \$150 more per child with state aid based on an average of the last three years rather than actual attendance.

In unrelated business, some district students will be able to participate in more sporting events.

Fifth and sixth grade students to take part in middle school sports. Fifth graders will be allowed to participate in track only while sixth graders may choose volleyball or basketball, as well, said board member Duane Sheppard of the extra-curricular committee.

Additionally, high school students will be allowed dual participation in sports programs. This change, which will be reviewed next year, will allow students to take part in football and soccer or football and golf, Conolly said.

Each student will have to choose one of the two as his primary sport.

In related discussion, Sheppard said a group of parents is researching a high school weight shed. The building would include a weight room, multi-purpose room and perhaps an area for awards, he said. The parents hope to raise funds through grants, alumni contributions and corporate donations. "Hopefully it wouldn't cost the school much of anything, if anything," Sheppard said.

Finally, the board approved resignations from Betty Shaffer, middle school library clerk and Shawn Lane as high school girls basketball coach and approved Lane as eighth grade volleyball coach; Patricia Martin, Early Childhood Special Education; Kristi Barr, middle school personal aide; and Rex Wilson, part time Maple custodian and approved contracts for certified and non-certified employees.

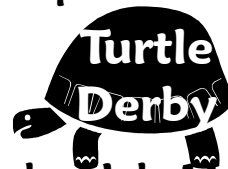

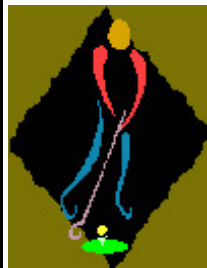
