## Saddle up for the annual Hoopeston Jaycees Turtle Derby

On your mark...get set...crawl.

It's time for the annual Hoopeston Jaycees' Turtle Derby.

The event will begin at 10 a.m. Saturday on Bank St., said event organizer Lenny Coffey.

Thus far, 70 turtles are scheduled to run...er, walk in several heats.

Twenty turtles, purchased at Pet and Hobby World in Danville, will be used throughout the race. After the finish, patrons wishing to take a turtle home may do so. "Once the Turtle Derby is done, I don't want them back," Coffey said.

This is Coffey's second year to coordinate the

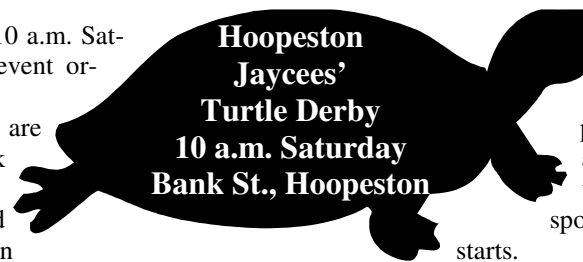
derby, which the Jaycees started in the 1970s. The race was discontinued for several years, then started up again, Coffey said, estimating it's been held for eight or nine years.

Sponsors pay \$10 for the privilege of naming a turtle and perhaps watching it race to victory. Coffey will accept sponsorships until the first race

starts.

Those who wish to get a head start may sponsor a turtle by calling Coffey at 283-9943.

Proceeds from the derby are used to fund Jaycee projects, including sending children to the organization's Camp New Heart, Coffey said.
