City officials list cleanup tips following Sunday's storm

As work on cleaning up after Sunday's storm progresses, city officials have made announcements concerning debris. Those affected by the storm are asked to note the following:

•Residents do not have to put storm debris at curbside. Those who have stacked limbs and other debris in their alleys may leave it there for pickup.

•Those who have toxic waste such as old paint, are asked to call Hoopeston ESDA co-coordinator Rod Drollinger at 283-7325. He will contact the Illinois

Environmental Protection Agency to set up a toxic collection site.




