Ag department offering grants for sustainable agriculture

SPRINGFIELD—The Illinois Department of Agriculture will award \$750,000 in grants this fiscal year to promote the development of new, more profitable farming practices that conserve natural resources.

The funding is available through the department's Sustainable Agriculture Grant Program. Applications are due Oct. 1, 2001.

"Year after year, Illinois farmers are among the most productive and efficient producers in the world because of the care they take to protect their soil and water," said Illinois Agriculture Director Joe Hampton.

The grants are competitive and will fund on-farm and university research projects, as well as outreach and education programs. "This program was started to spur innovation in production agriculture and the quality and diversity of projects that have been funded are quite impressive, said program representative Mike Rahe.

The Sustainable Agriculture Grant Program was established in 1996 as part of the Conservation 2000 program to develop and implement methods of production that protect natural resources without sacrificing farm profitability.
