'Earth Protectors' to visit Hoopeston, Rossville schools

A live theatrical, educational production called "the Earth Protectors" will be performed for nine Vermilion County elementary schools this week.

The production will be presented to students at Maple and Honeywell schools in Hoopeston and Rossville-Alvin Elementary School Wednesday. Maple will be the first stop, at 8:45 a.m., followed by Honeywell at 10 a.m. and Rossville at 1:30 p.m.

The Vermilion County Recycling Program offered matching grant funds to county elementary schools for this program. Many county schools focus on environmental issues such as reducing, reusing and recycling and these schools have chosen to host this performance for their students to further enhance classroom lessons by the magic of theater.

KidsMatter National Theatre, the professional touring children's theatre company based in Monticello, presents the play and crates performances encouraging students to take responsibility for their own behavior. "The Earth Protectors" educates students

about the need for each of us to take care of our environment while reinforcing the "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Rethink" theme.

In the play, two young people realize they are surrounded by garbage in their neighborhood and think they are powerless to do anything about it. They speak to an adult mentor who helps them realize they can make a difference in the world.

All schools that participate receive classroom study guides suggesting ways teachers can promote themes of the play through the use of drama in their own classrooms.

The "Earth Protectors" have been in demand in elementary schools throughout the Midwest and Eastern states since January 1997.

Recycling coordinator Lynn Wolgamot urged "anyone in the county who can take 45 minutes from their day to view one of the performances at the school nearest you. Kids laugh with delight as the "earth protectors" learn to be productive citizens.


