Hoopeston residents affected by New York City crashes

Residents gather to remember dead, pray for country

More than 70 Hoopeston residents gathered Wednesday morning at the McFerren Park Civic Center to remember those killed in Tuesday's terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center and Pentagon and to pray for survivors, families and our nation.

The attack "is a monumental reminder of the two treasures we have" in life and family and friends, said Mayor Chalmers Flint, choking back tears. Flint called the attack "a terrorist attack on all Americans."

The Rev. Ardeen Webster read from Psalm 46, saying "God is our refuge and our strength. The Rev. Anne Swartz prayed, saying Tuesday's "numbness turned to grief and pain and anger." She asked for blessings for Hoopeston residents, "especially those touched by the tragedy."

Following a trumpet solo of "God Bless America" by Hoopeston Area band director Mark Lindvahl, those attending left in silence, many wiping tears from their eyes.

Gas lines form following rumors of price hikes

Reports of increased gas prices, up to \$5 or \$6 per gallon, sent Hoopeston motorists to the pumps in droves Tuesday afternoon and evening.

Lines began forming around 3:30 and increased steadily through the afternoon, requiring Hoopeston police to direct traffic at stations in the city. Some residents filled not only their vehicles but any container that would hold additional gasoline.
