## Memory Walk to benefit Alzheimer's slated for Saturday

Hoopeston residents will once again take part in the annual Memory Walk sponsored by the Alzheimer's Association Greater Illinois Chapter.

Registration for the walk will be held at 8:30 a.m. Saturday at McFerren Park. The event will begin at 9 a.m.

The walk is a fundraiser for the Alzheimer's Association and is the single largest source of support for services to area families who are dealing with the disease. All proceeds from the walk will be used to provide local services including a toll-free helpline, information resources and referrals, support groups, conferences, train-

ing, seminars and a large lending library.

The goal of Memory Walk 2001 is to raise \$100,000. Each walker raising \$25 or more will receive a Memory Walk 2001 t-shirt. Other incentives will be awarded to walkers raising \$150, \$300 and \$600.

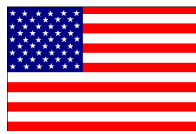
