Archery deer season begins, Hoopeston check station opens

Archery deer season began Oct. 1 and with it the opening of northern Vermilion County's only deer check station.

Oat's Bait Shop, 517 S. Dixie Hwy., is a check station for deer bagged by archery, muzzleloader and handgun, said owner Odie Milner.

Hunters using shotguns must use the check station in Danville.

Archery season runs from Oct. 1 through Jan. 18 but is closed for shotgun weekends on Nov. 16-18 and Nov. 29-Dec. 2, as well as for muzzle loading weekend, Dec. 7-9.

There is no limit on the number of doe and young bucks—with horns less than three inches—hunted with bow and arrow, Milner said. Only two antlered bucks may be taken.

Hunters using muzzleloaders are limited to one deer per permit and handgun users may only bag does and young bucks, he said.

Oat's Bait Shop will be open from 6 a.m.-6 p.m. Tuesday through Friday, 6 a.m.-5 p.m. Saturday and 6 a.m.-3 p.m. Sunday to accommodate hunters.


