

Outdoor Amusement group offers carnival bill compromise

A compromise measure may get a bill regulating carnival workers out of political limbo.

House Bill 60, which would have required carnivals to provide the names, dates of birth and Social Security numbers of employees to local police departments, has been met with a counterproposal from the Outdoor Amusement Association, representing carnivals, said Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger.

Drollinger was instrumental in getting the bill before legislators. It was introduced to the House by Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville).

Under the compromise measure, carnival employees who operate rides would receive state identification cards through the Illinois State Police. The cards would be similar to Firearms Owners Identification (FOID) cards, Drollinger said.

The countermeasure would provide 30 days' notice to municipalities, rather than the 60 days requested in the original bill.

Drollinger, who spoke on the issue at Monday's Neighborhood Watch, expressed concern that only ride operators would be required to have identification. However, "I've been told that, due to the size of the carnivals, training is diverse" and most employees would be required to have the cards because they are cross-trained on all aspects of carnival work.

House Bill 60 moved quickly through several hearings before becoming stalled by a lobbyist from the Outdoor Amusement Association. "It was pretty much dead in the water until about two weeks ago," Drollinger said.

Carnival owners balked at the bill. One, Jon Luehrs, owner of Leuhrs Spectacular Attractions which has served the National Sweetcorn Festival since 1996, said House Bill 60 unfairly targeted carnival workers and might put an end to carnivals in the state.

The new offer is being billed "as a model policy for the other 49 states" by the Association, Drollinger said.

The counter offer may make the fall veto session but with legislators looking at redistricting, it may not be heard.

ROSSVILLE—A bare wall has become a focal point for patriotism that a group of local residents hope will be used by all area people.


