Big kid at Hoopeston Public Library celebrates 30 years

When it comes to the children's room at the Hoopeston Public Library, you might say librarian Carol Arnold is the biggest kid of all.

Arnold recently celebrated her 30th anniversary as children's librarian and has no plans to

A fluke started Arnold's career at the library. Then-head librarian Louise Griner thought a resume submitted for an opening as children's librarian came from Arnold when, in fact, it did not. "I didn't send a resume or anything to come here," Arnold said. "I came in and talked to her and she hired me."

Since then, Arnold has been instilling a love of reading in children by making books fun. One bit of fun is serving green eggs and ham to young readers of the Dr. Seuss classic. "I've had flops," she said. "The first year I did it, it didn't turn out to well. The key is to put the food color in before cooking. It turns into a nice, yucky green."

Arnold has also made a replica of the Titanic to hang in the

movie room, held ice cream socials, done the limbo and dealt with more reptiles and amphibians than many people would care to, all in the name of getting children to



In her spare time, Arnold writes to famous people to find out what books they read as children. She passes the information along to her small charges. She's received responses from such people as Ret. Gen. Norman Swartzkopf, Christopher Reeves, then-Texas governor George W. Bush and former President Jimmy Carter. "His letter was just so nice," she said. "He sounded so humble and caring.".

Thirty years has provided Arnold with a sense of continuity, tending to children whose parents she knew as children. She doesn't forget her kids and they don't forget her. "Even after years and years, I still remember what they liked to read," Arnold said.

One example of the bond she shares with former young readers was evident one day after the Sept. 11 bombing of the World Trade Center. Mary (Christine) Tselepsis, whose husband died in the attack, had been a frequent visitor to the

library as a child. To help one of "her" children, Arnold set out a piece of paper on which library staff and others
