Hoopeston Area predicts 11.4 percent hike in '02 tax levy

Hoopeston Area officials are estimating an 11.4 percent increase in the district tax levy.

The levy is the amount of money raised through property taxes and is done on an estimated basis because district officials will not know until March 2002 what the assessed valuation of the district is, said district financial manager Don Dean.

While Dean estimated an 11.4 percent increase, the actual amount may be several percentage points lower, he said. As with the budget, Dean said he estimated a higher levy than what it actually will be to make sure the district does not lose not only property tax revenue

but state aid, which is figured using the levy, he said.

The tax rate, the amount residents pay on their property, is expected to increase by only three or four cents, Dean said.

The levy will be passed at the Nov. 8 board meeting. In unrelated business, area businesses were urged to beware of fund raisers by Superintendent Mark Conolly.

An out-of-town firm recently solicited funds for a book project sponsored by a Hoopeston service organization but that project was not sanctioned by the district, and school officials were not notified until the project was well underway. Conolly said.

Sanctioned fundraisers include sales of sausage, cheese, fruit and magazines, Conolly said.

Those who are approached by solicitors should contact the superintendent's office to learn if the sale is sanctioned. "If it's a kid at your door, it's probably a schoolsanctioned thing," he said. "We try to limit it as much as we can but we can't control these outside groups."

In other action, the board hired Jackie Leverenz in the cafeteria; Patricia Root, part time Maple aide; and Juan Robles as eighth grade boys basketball coach and accepted the resignation of Lisa Mayberry, cafeteria worker.
