

Area police lauded for foiling planned bank robbery

The Hoopeston Police Department is being praised for their quick response in foiling an attempted bank robbery Wednesday.

Three Hoopeston men were arrested Wednesday afternoon for allegedly planning to rob the Community Bank facility in Wellington.

"We appreciate the prompt response, especially out in the weather and everything" said Bill Nicholls, bank executive vice president and CEO. "It was dangerous for them out in that storm. They did a fantastic job."

Facing preliminary charges are:

- Jackie E. Winchester, 24, charged with theft over \$300, conspiracy to commit robbery and on Vermilion County warrants for an ordinance violation and an Iroquois County warrant for resisting arrest.
- Stuart R. Anthony, 28, charged with theft over \$300, aggravated fleeing and eluding a police officer and conspiracy to commit robbery.
- Daniel J. Crowley, 21, who was charged with theft over \$300 and conspiracy to commit robbery.

The men were being held Thursday at the Public Safety Building in Danville in lieu of bond.

Police said the men allegedly stole a vehicle from a Danville car dealership and returned to Hoopeston. At

2:07 p.m., police began a chase with the vehicle, which ended when the driver lost control of it in the Cheneyville area.

One of the men was arrested at the scene. The other two fled on foot and were later apprehended.

According to a police department press release, the trio allegedly "had taken significant steps in planning and conspiring to commit a robbery."

While bank officials are grateful to police, the department is thanking the public for calling in information as well as police departments that assisted in capturing the men. Those departments include the Iroquois and Vermilion County sheriff's departments, and Indiana police departments from Benton and Warren counties and Oxford.


