# Hoopeston Jaycees hold annual holiday toy donation drive

Those stuffed animals the kids have outgrown can find a new home and bring smiles to new faces.

The Hoopeston Jaycees are once again collecting new and used toys during their Toys for Kids campaign.

New and clean used toys in good condition may be placed in drop-off boxes throughout Hoopeston, said event coordinator Delores Crabtree. Toys may also be taken to the Grant Township office, 525 S. Market, or to Crabtree's home at 1004 McKinley Ave. "I don't care where they take them as long as I get the toys," she said.

Any child up to 12 years of age who is in the Hoopeston Area school district is eligible to receive toys, she said. All families who wish to receive toys must go through the Grant Township screening program. The last day to be screened is Wednesday.

Toys will be collected until Dec. 16 and will be displayed in the McFerren Park Civic Center Dec. 18-20 so parents may choose toys for their children, Crabtree said. Families who qualify for the program will receive letters telling them when to pick up toys.

The number of children who receive toys is expected to increase this year. Last year, about 185 children were helped. This year, Crabtree already has 145 names. "At the rate we're going, I imagine we'll be close to 200,"
