
### State representative to run for 53rd District senate seat



worked to expand the area from which Ryan could make budget cuts but that plan was blocked by Democrats, leaving only certain areas available for Ryan to cut. "He wasn't able to go over the whole budget," Rutherford said.

The infrastructure of small communities is also important to Rutherford, who would like to find ways to help with large capital expenses such as new sewer systems and water towers. "I don't want to have the small towns getting behind the big cities," he said.

Agriculture is another area of concern. As former head of the Illinois Department of Commerce's International Operations under former Gov. Jim Thompson, Rutherford was responsible for Illinois' overseas trade bureaus. "Illinois is the third state in the nation in exporting agricultural products and fifth in exporting manufacturing products," he said. "There's no question the global market is a big part of the economy of this state."

Rutherford said he would work to increase exports of not only ag products but also value-added items such as soybean oil, and would like to increase university funding for research into more value-added products.
