Hospital CEO seeks public input in making hospital better

Changes in Medicaid funding have hospital officials throughout the state scrambling to make up shortfalls in outpatient reimbursement.

The situation is no different at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, where CEO Frank Caruso is predicting a \$100,000 decrease in Medicaid funding this year.



We shouldn't let that happen.

We need our hospital for so many reasons. First, it's a convenience for us. Unlike residents of so many communities, we don't have to leave town to get our routine medical care. It's right here.

The services provided at the hospital are another convenience. The walk-in clinic, the emergency room are godsends to people who need them. Having a physical therapy department means people can use those services rather than traveling to Danville, Champaign or Watseka to get stronger. The same is true of the lab and x-ray departments. It's so much easier to drive to the hospital for such things than to be forced to drive out of town.

Second, our hospital is a lifesaver in emergency situations. There are many medical procedures that cannot be done at Hoopeston Community Memorial and those patients who need them are sent to hospitals where the procedures can be done. But in crisis situations, it's not only comforting but critical that we have our hospital to stabilize severely injured or sick patients before they are sent to other facilities. Unless you've watched your mother having a heart attack or seen your child bleeding profusely after an accident, it may be hard to understand the importance of that role but I'm sure countless numbers of lives have been saved because our doctors and nurses stabilized someone before sending them on.

Having a hospital is important not only from a medical perspective but also from an economic stand-point. Officials say the hospital is the largest employer in our community. Unless income is kept up, many hospital employees may face cuts in hours and salaries, if not their jobs. That won't help the local economy.

Furthermore, if we hope to bring industry to town, or if we want to build a housing development to attract people to Hoopeston, having a hospital will be a plus.

Hospital officials hope Hoopeston will get behind the hospital turning out in a way similar to when the city was a contender for a new prison. That needs to be done but first, residents must be comfortable using the hospital and its services. To do that, Caruso has asked that citizens who have questions or problems with the hospital make those concerns known and has asked me to help.

During the next few weeks, Just the Facts will publish a series of articles on the hospital, including pieces on the services offered as well as those addressing what you see as problems there. Caruso wants to hear concerns about all aspects of the hospital, from patient care to the physical structure, to the board and even himself.
