July 2001 storm blows up wealth of Hoopeston history

A cliché says it's an ill wind that blows no one any good. That adage proved true for the city of Hoopeston.

The July 8, 2001 storm, which wreaked havoc on city homes and industries, blew up a wealth of historical information.

When city workers poked through the former water building on Main St., they found city record books dating back to Hoopeston's founding in 1871.

The books detail all aspects of city business, from the first person buried at Floral Hill Cemetery in 1871 to minutes of the town meeting at which Hoopeston was incorporated in 1873 to employee wages in the 1960s.

The books were found in old trunks in the second floor of the water building, said water superintendent Steve Baker. "We couldn't move the trunks because we were afraid they'd fall apart," he said. So the books were taken from the trunk, placed in an end loader and moved before the building was torn down.

Hoopeston administrative assistant Loni Garman is fascinated with the amount of history contained in the books and how well they have stood the test of time. "I can't believe how good a condition they're in," she said. The covers of some of the books bear moisture damage but the pages are legible records of Hoopeston's earliest city government at work.

In a volume dating from 1873, the names leaders who incorporated the town are neatly written, along with a detailed account of what happened at the meeting. An ink drawing serves as an official seal.

Other tomes contain information on burial plots at Floral Hill, including the first interment on Jan. 7, 1871 of 23-year-old Lucy S. Chapman who died of consumption. A related book shows the price of a

cemetery lot at \$10 in 1888.

Registries of death certificates show that, like now, residents died from a multiple of causes, some no longer heard of today. One person died of "softening of the brain" and several passed away due to "general debility. One person was run over by a train while another perished because of an "accidental fracture of the skull."

Some causes of death sound more familiar, from

cancer and tuberculosis to pneumonia and indigestion.

A "record of city receipts and indebtedness" from the late 1880s shows Thomas Hoopes received \$2 in interest on donations.

In 1917, T.M. Elliott was an agent for the Aetna Insurance Company. His customers, their policies and payment histories are duly recorded in a book.

Another volume dated 1925 lists the names of residents who borrowed money from the Hoopeston Improvement Fund. The record indicates when each of the loans is to be repaid and who was timely and delinquent in their payments.

Who paid fines for various offenses is also listed, as are tax payments made by citizens in the city.

Wage records are also kept, from very early on until the 1960s when then street superintendent and former police chief Orval Kaag received \$235 every two weeks.

Officials hope to preserve the newfound links to the past. From the plastic bags and boxes the books are currently in, they will hopefully be moved to containers that keep them from further deterioration.

Garman said librarian Lou Graham is searching for catalogs on such containers. Other volumes, like the one containing information on the city's formation and incorporation, will be kept in the city's fireproof safe.

Eventually, Garman said she hopes all the information is able to be cataloged so current officials will have an orderly account of what their forefathers accomplished. "There's so much information," she said. "Everything you want to know is there...if you know where to find it."
