Lafayette, Ind., man arrested in California for two murders

A Lafayette, Ind., man was arrested in California Monday, charged with the murders of two men found near Henning.

Jerry Joe Fuentes, 49, was arrested at 6 p.m. in Riverside Calif., charged with two counts of murder in the deaths of Alejandro Rodriguez, 24, and Juan Hernandez, 15, both of Lafayette, said Vermilion County Sheriff's Department Investigator Rod Kaag.

The counts were filed Feb. 19 and warrants were issued by the Tippecanoe County, Ind., Superior Court. The warrants were sealed until Fuentes' arrest

due to his risk of flight, Kaag said.

Fuentes is being held without bond and is expected to be extradited to Lafayette.

The bodies of Rodriguez and Hernandez were found in the early morning hours of Feb. 5 on County Road 2900N between Henning Rd. and Route 1. The men had last been seen together during the evening hours of Feb. 4 in Lafayette.

The men's bodies were found by an area resident who flagged down a patrolling Vermilion County Sheriff's deputy.

Finance chairman recommends purchase policy change

Hoopeston aldermen will consider a revamped ordinance that will make purchasing items easier.

The change, suggested by finance committee chairman Alderman Bill Goodwine, would allow department heads to purchase budgeted items for costing up to \$1,000. Items up to \$5,000 would require a committee chairman's approval and items from \$5,000-\$10,000 would require approval of the department head, committee chairman and mayor.

Items over \$10,000 must be bid by state law.

Non-budgeted items of up to \$1,000 could be approved by the committee chair; purchases up to \$5,000 could be allowed by the chairman and mayor and those over \$5,000 would require council approval.

Under Goodwine's proposal, used items might follow the same guidelines. Unlike new items, however, instead of requiring bids, which require writing specifications, the city might seek quotes, he said.

In emergencies, Goodwine suggested that rather than require approval of the affected committee and the finance committee, the affected committee and mayor approve purchases.

Aldermen will review the proposal and make suggestions at the next meeting.

In unrelated business, Alderman Kevin Davis, water/sewer committee chairman, received two bids on a new water/fire building. The previous one was severely damaged in the July tornado.

Silver Brothers was the apparent low bidder with a base bid of \$210,898. J&J Development of Watseka bid \$265,000.

The base bid consists of a steel building to house both water and fire department equipment; however Davis will review prices of other options, including constructing a wooden building and having separate buildings for each department, before the committee makes a recommendation.

In other matters, the council:

- will meet March 18 instead of March 19, primary election day.
- heard from resident Candy LaBounty about speeding traffic on South Third St. The street/alley and police departments will look into it.
- learned a new dump truck will cost \$56,000.
