Young people judge youth offenders in Peer Court program

Young people serve as attorneys, judges and juries in a program aimed to keep troubled youth out of the court system.

Peer Court uses youth to prosecute, defend, convict and sentence young offenders, said program coordinator DeeAnn Ryan.

Ryan spoke at the Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting last week.

Peer Court began almost nine years ago as a way to keep first time youthful offenders out of the court system, Ryan said. Since then, about 750 young people have gone through the program.

The program is a punishment for juveniles who break the law. A jury of young people approves sen-

tences for offenders. Punishments include community service work, writing letters of apology to police, parents and the offended parties, writing an essay on the situation, touring the Vermilion County jail and returning to serve on the Peer Court jury, Ryan said. Often, in the case of shoplifting, the offender is also ordered not to return to the store for a set period of time.

To participate in Peer Court, a young person must admit that he committed the crime. The offender and a parent must attend an intake session where Ryan reviews the program and both the parent and child agree to follow the imposed sentence.

Offenders are given 90 days to complete the components of their sentences. Those who do not finish may have their case referred back to the court system. For those who do complete Peer Court, the charges are dismissed and the record of their crime may be expunged when the child turns 18.

Peer Court meets at least the first and third Tuesdays, usually more often. Three to seven cases are heard each night, Ryan said.

Unlike the court system, Peer Court is more immediate. "We've had kids in trouble on Friday and they

get into court the following Tuesday," Ryan said.

The program is not just about punishment. Young people who require other services are matched with providers, such as tutors, counselors, anger management specialists or, in cases of neglect, the Department of Children and Family Services.

The purpose of Peer Court is to not only punish offenders, but keep them from breaking the law again. "It may be the first time they've been in trouble but it probably won't be the last time unless they get help," Ryan said.

The program shows some children another way of life. For example, offenders who must do community service often do the work in an area in which they're interested. Many times, young people continue to volunteer even after their sentences are finished. "A lot of times it's not in their vocabulary to work, period because no one in their family has ever held a job," Ryan said.

Peer Court can turn a bad situation into an opportunity. Some sponsors of community service write

Peer Court is designed for children eight years old and older; however, one six-year-old child went through the program, Ryan said.

Approximately five Hoopeston young people have gone through Peer Court. The distance from Danville creates a hardship for many local young people, Ryan said, adding she would like to see a Peer Court program started in Hoopeston, using local young people and local attorneys as judges. "I really think it's the way to go.
