Local man has 'tasteful' way of raising cancer research funds

In exchange for tickling residents' palates, a Hoopeston man hopes to snag a little cash for cancer research.

Bill Goodwine, chairman of this year's Vermilion County American Cancer Society's "Relay for Life" wants to raise funds by offering taste bud-tempting recipes as thank-you gifts for donations.

Four recipes are available, including Italian bread dip for a \$1 donation; clam linguine for a \$5 contribution; Italian shrimp pasta in cream sauce for \$10 and Crème Renversee au Caramel for donations of \$25 or more.

Donors can receive all four recipes for \$40 or more but "I'm not real strict on this," Goodwine said. "If someone wanted them all and couldn't afford \$40, I'd send them all."

In fact, for larger contributions, Goodwine might consider doing all the work. "Somebody asked me if, for \$100, I would cook it," he said. "For \$100, I'd do just

Banking facilities to be sold

Old National Bancorp facilities in Hoopeston, Rankin and Potomac are among six branch offices sold to other companies.

The three, and a branch in Lynn, Ind., have been sold to Indiana United Bancorp of Greensburg, Ind.

Other facilities in Oblong and Robinson will be purchased by First National Bank of Olney.

The deal, which has not yet received regulatory approval, is expected to close midway this year.

"The sale of these locations reaffirms our long-term strategic and financial objectives, supporting our announcement a year ago that we may sell or close several offices," said Jim Risinger, chairman and CEO of the Evansville, Ind.-based Old National.

Indiana United Bancorp also includes Capstone Bank, headquartered in Watseka, which has banking centers in eastern Illinois and Western Indiana.

Scholarships to be awarded

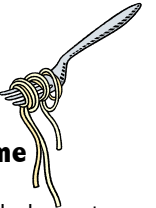

than the others but is worth the effort. "It's a custard but it's got this caramel sauce that's unbelievable," Goodwine said.

The recipes are concocted from other recipes. The idea for the bread dip came from an Old Pasadena, Calif., restaurant. "They gave me the ingredients and I played with them until I got something I liked," said Chef Bonvin (translated into French from Goodwine). The clam and shrimp dishes were modified from other recipes and the flan is a combination of three recipes, he said.

This is the second time Goodwine has traded recipes for donations. Two years ago, he offered delicacies with a New Orleans flavor and raised about \$2,300.

Anyone wishing to receive the recipes may make

checks out to the American Cancer Society and mail them to Goodwine at 806 E. Washington St., Hoopston, IL 60942. He will mail the recipes in return.

Goodwine hopes those who try the recipes will let him know how they turn out. "Half the fun is talking about it," he said.

"We're going to make Hoopeston the gourmet capital of the world."
