Surf 'N' Turf Professional Lawn Care opens in Hoopeston

This spring, treat your lawn to a professional lawn treatment. A new business offers just that.

Surf 'N' Turf Professional Lawn Treatments was opened recently by Tim Sharlach. The business offers lawn fertilization and weed control, along with balancing the Ph level of soil.

"I'm taking a professional approach to this business," said Sharlach, who formerly managed the HFC Turf division of Hoopeston Fertilizer.

Through training at HFC Turf and continuing education, Sharlach said he has been "trained enough to calibrate equipment to put down exactly what each yard needs."

Sharlach is licensed as a commercial applicator through the Illinois Department of Agriculture's turf grasses class. He is also able to do right-of-way spraying

on areas between streets and private property and in driveways.

Sharlach takes a scientific approach to lawn care. For example, a correct Ph level improves the health of a lawn. A rating of 6-7 provides optimum conditions and by using soil samples, Sharlach will apply chemicals to reach that optimum level. Customers may receive a free estimate prior to work being done, he said.

Although Surf 'N' Turf will not provide such services as mowing and trimming, Sharlach said he has plans to include those things in the future.

Sharlach based his decision to open the business, in part, on the things he enjoyed while managing HFC Turf for two years. "I like working with the customers and being outside," he said. "It's like a breath of fresh air."


