Rossville committee completes Memorial Tree Program

ROSSVILLE—A program estimated to take three
years has been completed.

The memorial tree program, announced last Au-
gust, has been completed, said Chairman Tom Mills.

The tree project allowed people to purchase trees
and shrubbery to be planted at Christman Park. Each
tree is to be tagged with the species and name of the
person in whose honor it was purchased.

Forty-nine trees and 19 shrubs were purchased in
the Memorial Tree program, Mills said. Varieties of

trees offered included seedless ash, red maple, red
bud and flowering crab apple.

Committee members will affix brass plaques to
trees Saturday in time for a dedication ceremony at 2
p.m. Sunday, Mills said. Those who have purchased
foliage will receive a map specifying where their tree
or shrub is located in the park.

The Memorial Tree Project was started with two
goals, Mills said. The first was to raise money for the
park district and also to replenish trees in the park.

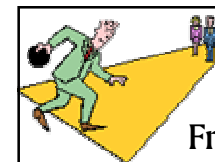
