Rescheduled Healthy Heart seminar to be held Tuesday

Hoopeston Regional Health Center has rescheduled the Healthy Heart seminar for Tuesday, April 30 at the Charlotte Ann Russell Medical Center.

The previous seminar was cancelled due to weather conditions.

The seminar will focus on understanding and preventing heart disease. Attendees will begin the seminar by receiving cholesterol and blood pressure screenings. Those readings can be taken any time between 4:30-5:15 p.m. Each person will receive a card showing his total cholesterol and blood pressure numbers before the start of a presentation by Dr. Travis Crawford at 5:15 p.m.

Dr. Crawford will discuss the significance of cholesterol readings and provide additional information about heart disease.

Following Dr. Crawford's presentation, registered dietitian Beth Tothoroh will offer new findings on fat.

Cost for the seminar is \$10, which covers the cost of the

cholesterol screening.
