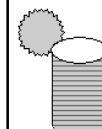

Men arrested after high-speed chase

Two men were arrested late Wednesday after a high-speed chase through the local countryside.

According to police, the incident began at 11:52 p.m. when officers were called to Parkview Court. A 19-year-old woman reported that Matthew Cannon, 21, of 101 S. Fifth St., broke the passenger side window of her 1997 Mercury.

Police said Cannon fled the scene in a vehicle driven by Adam C. Fritz, 20, of 407 N. Grove, Rossville. Fritz left Parkview Court south on Sixth Ave. to 4000 N Rd. (Lover's Lane), then east to 1550 E Rd. (Hospital Road), then south to 3800 N, the west to Rt. 1.


Officers lost sight of the vehicle, which Rossville police later saw entering the village. Rossville and Hoopeston police found the vehicle at Fritz' home.

Officers arrested Cannon at the home but police said Fritz fled on foot. He later turned himself in at the Hoopeston police station.

Cannon was charged with criminal damage to property and was released on a notice to appear.

Fritz was charged with aggravated fleeing and eluding, four counts of speeding and driving without
