Hoopeston schools set 2002-03 registration information

Hoopeston Area school officials are already looking forward to the beginning of the new school year.

Registration information for the upcoming year was discussed at Thursday's school board meeting.

The registration schedule is:

Monday, Aug. 12 - ninth grade, last names A-L 8:30-11 a.m.; M-Z 12:30-3 p.m.

Tuesday, Aug. 13 - grades 7 and 10, last names A-L 8:30-11 a.m.; M-Z 12:30-3 p.m.

Wednesday, Aug. 14 - Maple, Honeywell and John Greer registration, 1-6 p.m., middle school; grades 8 and 11, last names A-L 8:30-11 a.m.; M-Z 1-6 p.m. (extended hours for those unable to register earlier.)

Thursday, Aug. 15 - grade 12, last names A-L 8:30-11 a.m.; M-Z 12:30-3 p.m.

Kindergarten orientation will also be held Aug. 15, from 6:30-7:30 p.m. at Maple.

Fees this year are:

- Early Childhood - \$22 book rental.
- K-6 - \$26 book rental.
- 7-8 - \$29 book rental, \$1 locker fee.
- High school - \$33 book rental, \$1 locker fee.

High school students in current events will owe \$8 for newspapers; seniors taking government, economics or

behavioral science will pay \$10 per semester for magazines.

In other business, the board:

- accepted resignations from Troy Hatton as assistant football coach and Tricia Schieler as eighth grade girls basketball coach.

- named Theresa Johnson to Maple special ed; Javier Diaz, high school/middle school chorus; Jonathan Layden, bus driver; Linda Duffin, seventh grade volleyball; Sarah Troxel, transfer from Maple to Honeywell special ed

- approved bids from Watseka Dairy for milk products; Lewis Bakeries for breads and Illini FS for fuel. Transportation director Darrell Brown noted the diesel will have a soy additive.

- discussed the telecommunications tax recently imposed by the Hoopeston City Council. Superintendent Mark Conolly reported that Mayor Chalmers Flint said he will sponsor an ordinance creating a rebate for other taxing bodies. Conolly estimated that will save the school district \$2,300-\$2,400 yearly.

- approved the federally-funded fall migrant program, which is expected to have about 110 students at a cost of about \$40,000, said program director Larry Hill.
