Web page proposal begs question 'isn't there a better way?'

The Hoopeston City Council will meet tomorrow night, in a continuation of its July 16 meeting. One of the topics on the agenda is approving a contract with Robert Davis of CDA Marketing in Watseka.

Alderman Bill Goodwine has called a "kind of unique marketing tool" for \$22,500.

What that means is Davis wants to create a website for Hoopeston, specifically to help sell vacant buildings.

The issue of a web page has generated a lot of comment among residents. I've heard more about this than I have any issue in a long time, including Sunday liquor sales. Complaints have ranged from the cost to not using local talent for the job.

Davis first became a blip on Hoopeston's radar screen on June 4 when he made a pitch to the council. His presentation didn't make many waves in the media because that was the meeting when the city discussed raising water rates.

Davis told the council that he "can guarantee you, people will buy your buildings." He later modified that and said he would "virtually guarantee" Davis has proposed creating what by LOURDINE FLOREK owners would be found for the buildings and said he is interested in economic

development for "future political reasons."

He also said he is "completely overqualified to build vour site."

His qualifications include having worked for the National Security Administration as a cryptologist and having top secret clearance. Apparently that training is handy when it comes to determining key words that will cause Hoopeston's web page to get more traffic.

The council briefly discussed Davis' proposal on June 18, when Mayor Chalmers Flint named aldermen Bill



On June 21, Flint called a last-minute meeting with Davis and the committee. They never did meet with the local men.

Then, at its July 16 meeting, the council agreed it didn't want to spend \$22,500 on a web site. Aldermen only want to pay \$14,500 payable from tax increment financing (TIF) funds.

So now they're ready to vote on the contract with Davis and CDA Marketing. I have concerns about that.

First, whether the city spends \$22,500 or \$14,500, it's too much. Web sites which include all the facets Davis outlined can be created for far less - thousands less, in fact.

Furthermore, if the city's paying less, which of CDA's services are being cut? The proposal did not include a cost breakdown for designing, copyrighting, maintenance, hosting or any other service so it's hard to tell which parts will be shorted.

And how can Davis guarantee - or even virtually guarantee - that buildings will be sold? While he may be able to position Hoopeston's page to get hits - most likely on a "pay-per-click" basis -he cannot guarantee that anyone will buy a building here. And you don't need to be a rocket scientist to figure out which key words people use when looking for commercial buildings.

If he is that confident, perhaps he would agree to CDA Marketing accepting a performance fee rather than a flat fee. If one building sells, CDA would receive a specified amount. If two building sold, the amount would be increased. I wouldn't mind if CDA ended up making more than \$22,500 if we sold our vacant buildings to someone who would create jobs.

And why is it that the council is not using local people - shopping Hoopeston first, if you will - for this project since we do have residents capable of doing the job?

High school computer classes design web pages. There are residents who make at least part of their living designing pages. If security clearance and cryptology skills are important, the city has an employee who has those, along with web page experience, who would fit the bill.

Since web page design is a service, similar to hiring an engineer or attorney, the council does not have to get bids but perhaps it would have been prudent for the council to meet with other designers to compare fees and abilities. Maybe they should have met with Eyrich and LaBounty if for no other reason than to get information to better gauge the feasibility of CDA's plan.

It seems to me that CDA's proposal, while a sophisticated marketing job, is too expensive and the guarantee too good to be true.

And you know what they say about that.
