

Officers commended for actions leading to four arrests

Two Hoopeston police officers were commended by Chief Mark Drollinger for their work in apprehending four suspects Monday night.

Officers Ephriam Bolin and Jeremy Welch were recognized at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

BOLIN In a letter to the council, Drollin-

ger praised the actions of the officers when they saw a dark-colored vehicle pull into an alley on East Wyman with the vehicle lights turned off. After driving around the block, the officer saw three people trying to get into a parked vehicle. When spotted, the people ran to their vehicle. Welch and Bolin arrested two adults and two juveniles who were preliminarily charged with theft of a motor vehicle and burglary from a motor vehicle.

In his letter, Drollinger said the suspects had committed burglaries in Hoopeston, Milford, Rossville, Bismarck, Henning and Danville. Four vehicles allegedly stolen by the suspects were also recovered.
