Hoopeston Area board passes tentative deficit budget

Depending on how state school funding shakes out. the Hoopeston Area school district budget could finish the 2002-03 year with a negative balance. Or not.

The school board on Thursday passed a deficit budget, a worst-case scenario of district finances for the year.

The budget shows income of \$8,900,483 and expenses of \$9,728,366, said Superintendent Mark Conolly. It is about one percent more than last year's budget.

The new numbers reflect every dire situation that could befall the district, including slashed state aid payments, which could come to pass if the state budget runs out of money during the school year, Conolly told the board.

Although state aid has been figured into the state

budget, "that money's not locked in," he said. "It's in the budget but they don't have the money. It's a gloomy picture."

Should the state default on budgeted state aid, the district has about \$1 million in reserves to cover the shortfall, he said.

Not only is the per-student amount expected to drop, but the state is paying prorated amounts for special education costs and other mandated programs in the schools. Also, Hoopeston Area lost more than \$90,000 in personal property tax, further straining the budget.

Painting a grim picture, the end result may be more positive. "We want the good news at the end of the year, not necessarily at the beginning," he said.

In other business, the board:

• hired Daphne High, high school math/middle school Scholastic Bowl; LeAnne Stebbins, middle school personal aide; Nolan Gonzalez, sixth/seventh grade girls basketball; and Scott Henk, assistant football coach.

• transferred Ginger Samet from sixth/seventh grade girls basketball to seventh grade girls basketball.

• approved resignations from April Bailey, high school math; Kristi Barr, personal aide; and Suzzette Hesser, fifth grade.










