Hoopeston man faces prison, fine for embezzling money

A former Hoopeston bank official is facing up to 30 years in prison and up to a \$1 million fine for embezzling money.

Brian K. Williams, 39, of Hoopeston, pleaded guilty to embezzling approximately \$20,000 from the former Palmer American National Bank.

Williams pleaded guilty to taking the money between May 28, 1998 and July 23, 1999 while he was employed as a loan officer. He took the money by issuing cashier's checks which were left unfunded on the bank's books and by taking money that was listed as draws against customers' loan accounts.

Williams appeared in federal court in Urbana, waiving his right to have a the case presented to a federal grand

Williams told Judge Michael McCuskey that he has made partial restitution to the bank.

He is scheduled to be sentenced Jan. 2, 2003.
