



Illinois First grant to help fund hospital renovations

Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital's renovation program got a shot in the arm this week when officials learned they received a \$205,000 Illinois First grant.

The grant, through the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, took nearly a year of work, said hospital CEO Frank Caruso. He approached Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville) about backing the grant application. "I said 'we can't get money from Medicaid and we've never applied for a grant so can you help us out." Caruso said.

It took three months for Black to get an application for the capital improvement grant, and several more months to gather information for the grant.

Russell Medical Center project and a 1999 bond issue for \$1 million to pay for the project, estimated at \$1.2-\$1.4 million. It includes a new outpatient entrance, radiology suite, lab area, expanded therapy services and to create more privacy in the emergency room, he said.

The price tag on the renovation, originally estimated at \$1 million, increased because of the age of the hospital and other factors, causing Caruso to seek more funding. "This covers us," he said.

Caruso learned of the announcement reading a Champaign paper Monday morning. "I nearly spit out my coffee when I read it," he said. "It was one of the best Mondays I have ever had."

Caruso credits Black with getting the money. "It is almost impossible for us as an organization to express our gratitude to Rep. Black for helping us receive this grant," he said. A small amount as far as state grants go, "it means the world to us," he said.

Stratum, Inc., a St. Louis-based design/build company, is the project contractor. Local subcontractors are being used, including Hoopeston Electric, Leemon Enterprises for the rubber roof and break metal and Ervin Construction for concrete work, said project superintendent Wayne Pinson.

The project is expected to be completed by late


