With Christmas just nine days away, many shoppers are looking for that last little something to make their gift-giving complete.

For those on your list who like music, especially Christian music, a local group has a new compact disc perfect for Christmas giving.

"We Shall Fight On" is the new CD by the Allens father Keith and sons Chad, 21, Gordon, 18 and Daniel, 16.

The disc, recorded in June, was something the group had talked about for some time. The actual recording took significantly less time. It was done in one day to allow the family to return to their East Lynn fertilizer business. "We probably won't do that again," Keith Allen said, laughing.

This was the newest venture for Allen, who has released two albums in the last 10 years, and his sons. "It was a great amount of fun," he said. "It's something the family enjoys doing. We like doing it together." The family worked with Gary McSpadden on the venture. The Allens were able to drum up interest because they are a family. "There are very few family groups," he said.

The CD was recorded in Summitsville, Ind., just five miles north of where the Gaither Vocal Band records their Christian tracts. The studio was started by a former drummer for the Gaither band in an old chicken shed. And while that may make it seem unprofessional, the studio is used by other Christian artists, such as Sandy Patti, Allen said.

"We Shall Fight On" includes covers of songs by other groups, including Squire Parsons, Greater Vision and the Gaither Vocal Band. "It's inspirational-type music," Allen said. "A lot of people out there are hurting. It's amazing what music can do."

The CD of We Shall Fight On sells for \$15; cassette tapes are less. They are not available in stores but may be ordered from Barbara Allen, P.O. Box 25, East Lynn, IL. 60932.


