Local candidates file to get names on April 1 election ballot

Some local candidates wasted no time getting their petitions filed for the April 1 election.

Incumbent John Haughee filed four a four-year term representing voters in Ward 2. He was the only Hoopeston candidate to file by 2 p.m. Tuesday, said administrative assistant Loni Garman.

The seats of incumbents Ed Lotz of Ward 1 and Nancy Stipp in Ward 3 are up for re-election as is a two-year term in Ward 2. That seat is currently held by Carl Ankenbrand.

All incumbents and two others have picked up election packets.

One seat in Ward 4 is also up. That seat, formerly held by Don York, is currently vacant. No one from Ward 4 has filed.

Election packets may be picked up any time to meet the filing deadline at 5 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 21. Petitions included in the packets must contain signatures of percentages of registered voters in each of the wards, Garman said. In Ward 1, candidates must have between 21 and 71 signatures; in Ward 2, 16-66

signatures; in Ward 3, 14-64; and in Ward 4, 22-72.

Two candidates for Hoopeston Area School Board also filed Monday. Incumbents Steve Unger and Mike Pemberton filed for their seats in the former Hoopeston School District.

Incumbent Mark Eighner is also up for re-election outside the old district.


