# Hoopeston Area schools' mid-vear finances in good shape

Halfway through the year, Hoopeston Area is on good financial footing.

Superintendent Mark Conolly released budget figures at Thursday's school board meeting.

Those figures show that the district's major funds, including education, building, transportation, Illinois Municipal Retirement, working cash and Life Safety, are all in good cash positions.

The district's major fund, the education fund, has received 54 percent of its budgeted revenue as well as 54 percent of its budgeted expenses. The building fund has gotten 92 percent of its revenue and 36 percent of its expenses; transportation 74 percent income and 51 percent expenses, IMRF 88 percent income, 23 percent expenses; working cash 47 percent income with no loans from the fund; and Life Safety, 96 percent of income and 42 percent of expenses.

"In all cases, we're in a good cash position," Conolly said, adding that may change under the new governor.

Rossville-Alvin and Hoopeston Area currently share not only sports programs but also some classes.

If shared athletics are approved, it does not mean the districts will merge completely in the near future. Lobb said a recent newspaper article said Rossville-Alvin will not reorganize for two to five years, depending on their
