Trey, six, was one of many students who was fingerprinted, weighed, measured and photographed as part of Project KidCare.

The program was sponsored locally by the Hoopeston Police Department, Hoopeston Regional Healthcare Center and Hoopeston Area School District.

Officer Doug Wagoner was at Maple School to fingerprint students Monday. The prints, along with height and weight information and an instant camera picture, are placed in folders and given to parents to use in the event that a child becomes lost or is kidnapped.

Besides Wagoner, other volunteers included Ernie Garrett and Kathy Stahl of the Hoopeston Ambulance Service, Nancy Luke, and Charlene Drawdy, Hoopeston Regional Healthcare Center director of public relations.

Project Kidcare is a national program that was created in 1993, a joint venture between Polaroid and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

According to the U.S. Department of Justice, one million children are reported missing each year.


