

## Rossville-Alvin, Hoopeston Area committees talk sports co-op

The Bobcats are looking for a lair to share.

Representatives of the Rossville-Alvin school district met Tuesday with Hoopeston Area officials to discuss the possibility of a cooperative sports program.

Hoopeston Area was represented by the school board's extra-curricular committee, including chairman Duane Sheppard, Mark Eighner and John Smiley, as well as athletic




Representing Rossville-Alvin were committee members Roger Satterwhite, chairman, Ray Rice and Dale Lithgow, board members Dennis Price, Craig Potter and Lyndel Davan, principal Mark Janesky, athletic director Kevin Thomas and Superintendent Carl Sartwell.

"You can tell by having our whole board here that this is something we're seriously interested in," said Price, president of the Rossville-Alvin board.

Satterwhite explained the reason the district is considering a cooperative sports program is because of declining numbers. "It's getting harder and harder to field teams, competitive teams," he said.

Currently, Rossville-Alvin has cooperative teams with Hoopeston Area, Bismarck-Henning and Armstrong-Potomac. R-A officials hope to find one district with which to share all sports programs. Because of the shared athletic program, as well as sharing academic and vocational courses, "you guys are a logical choice for us," Satterwhite said.

Sartwell brought a 25-point checklist used by the Jamaica and Catlin districts when they formed the Salt



Rossville-Alvin would retain some sports and co-op others; and whether a cooperative would establish new school colors and a new mascot.

Whether a new mascot would be a stumbling block to a joint venture is undecided.

"If you're going to have a successful program drawing communities together, the easier you blend the communities, the better it's going to be," Price said.

Some Rossville-Alvin students are excited about choosing a new name and mascot, Satterwhite added. "It's not a do-or-die issue," he said. "It is a high priority issue."

From Hoopeston-Area's standpoint, a name change "could be an issue for people in this community," Eighner said.

Sheppard and Smiley spoke of the uniqueness of the Cornjerker name. "It's different than being a Ranger or a Hornet or a Duke," Smiley said.

While addressing the individuality of the Cornjerker name, "I hate to see that become an issue," Sheppard said. "There's pride in both communities and that's the way it should be."

Combining sports teams may be a first step toward combining the districts. "We're working towards reorganization or consolidation down the road," Rice said.

Price said, "I think eventually we'll have not only a passing interest but a pressing need," he said. "It would
