Childbirth is a driving experience for Hoopeston woman

Most women can detail the labor and delivery of their child by time of day.

Megan Braden can do hers by mile markers.

Braden and her husband, Andy, welcomed their son, Jackson Glenn, at about 1:44 a.m. Tuesday on the line between Vermilion and Champaign counties on I-74.

Braden had planned to have her baby Wednesday. On Monday, she took castor oil and had arranged for her sister-in-law, Lisa Longfellow, to stay with the couple's other children, Cole, 9, Drew, 5 and Sydney 1½ night. Those plans didn't work out.

Contractions started at about 7 p.m. She started hard labor at 11 p.m. "It just woke me straight up," she said. "I thought it would slow down but it didn't."

Braden spent the next while calling friends and neighbors to stay

with the other children. She also waited for Andy to dress. "He even put a belt on," she said. "Who wears a belt with a sweatshirt? Plus I was thinking 'we're not going to a fashion show, we're going to have this baby.""

Andy also had to stop at his business, BJ's Pump, to drop money off before leaving for the hospital. "I couldn't say anything about it then, but I can now," Megan Braden said. "And I have."

With business taken care of, the Bradens headed for Carle Foundation Hospital in Urbana. Driving down Rt. 49, Braden's water broke at the turnoff for

Rantoul. Jack crowned at the on-ramp to I-74. "I was using sweatshirts to keep the baby in," Braden said. Her husband kicked the family van into high gear, which did not go unnoticed by an Illinois State Police trooper.

Trooper Clay Woodard clocked the vehicle at 101 miles per hour and promptly stopped them, Braden said.

Andy Braden ran to the squad car telling Woodard he could ticket him but first asked him first to escort them to the hospital. Woodard could not do that but he did radio for an ambulance.

Keller and Jana Bear. It was the first delivery for the EMTs, Braden said. "It was fast and furious. It was hilarious."

The ambulance made one stop, in Ogden to pick up Covenant Medical Center paramedics and continued on to Carle where mother and son were checked over and deemed to be doing fine.

Unlike most birth certificates, Jack's is missing a few details, like the name of a doctor who delivered him and the place where he was delivered. Hoshauer is listed as the person who delivered him and as for the place, "it says 'enroute I-74," Braden said.
